



Leadership Through Service: Cadets provide a variety of services to the Charleston community — volunteering their time in the Cooper River Bridge Run and the 3 1/2 mile Beach Sweep of the Isle of Palms; helping the Junior League with its Whale of a Sale fundraiser; donating large amounts of needed blood to the American Red Cross; assisting Crisis Ministries and the Footlight Players; working with Habitat for Humanity; reaching out to local youth through the Bulldog-Bullpup Program; staging a leadership conference for middle school students; and taking part in the Charleston Clean City Sweep.

A Global Reach: The Citadel encourages Cadets to undertake foreign study through approved programs at institutions outside the United States. Full semester, Maymester, and summer programs are available. In recent years, Citadel Cadets have studied abroad in a number of countries including Australia, Austria, Czech Republic, Costa Rica, England, France, and Spain.

Moving Forward: A recent survey of students indicated the following post-graduate plans: employed in the civilian sector-50%; military service-34%; graduate school-10%; missionary/other volunteer work-2%; all other endeavors-4%. More than 96 percent of students surveyed were in graduate school or working within three months of graduation, one of the best records anywhere. Examples of firms employing graduates include Coopers & Lybrand Consulting, DuPont, Fluor-Daniel Engineering, Burlington Industries, Dean-Witter, Milliken, Moody's Investor Service, IBM, and Bank of America. Citadel Cadets have earned entry into some of the most prestigious graduate universities and professional schools of law and medicine anywhere, including Cambridge, Carnegie-Mellon, Duke, Georgetown, Harvard, Johns Hopkins, Southern California, Stanford, Syracuse, Boston College, University of California at Berkeley, University of Chicago, Tulane, and Yale, as well as outstanding regional institutions including Clemson, Emory, Medical University of South Carolina, University of North Carolina, University of Richmond, Vanderbilt, Wake Forest, and University of Virginia.

President's List: *Awarded for academic and military excellence.*

Commandant's List: *Awarded to those who contribute most to their company and who have an excellent academic and military record.*

The Star of the West Medal: *Awarded to the best-drilled Cadet.*

Society of Cincinnati Award: *Presented to the Cadet Officer who exemplifies to the highest degree those best qualities of a citizen-soldier.*

The Widder Award: *Presented in memory of Captain David Widder, Citadel Class of 1959, to the most outstanding Distinguished Military Student in Army ROTC.*
