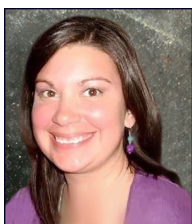

# Faculty Fellow Mentoring Program



CEITL&DE matches each new full-time faculty member with a Faculty Fellow outside of their department to serve as a mentor. Adjunct faculty are also invited to participate. The Faculty Fellow Mentoring program is designed to promote interdisciplinary collaboration and support professional development. The mentorship relationship typically involves regular meetings between the faculty member and their Faculty Fellow mentor. These meetings provide opportunities for:



- Sharing experiences, challenges, and successes in teaching, research, and professional development.
- Seeking advice, guidance, and feedback on teaching strategies, curriculum development, scholarly activities, etc.
- Exploring interdisciplinary collaboration opportunities and networking.
- Accessing resources and support offered by CEITL&DE or other relevant departments.

## Monday Morning Mentor Programming

CEITL&DE augments its face-to-face and online offerings with Monday Morning Mentor programming. Each week throughout the academic year, faculty members enjoy access to 20-minute professional development packages that cover a variety of timely topics. In addition to an engaging online video, each session also includes Microsoft PowerPoint handouts, a transcript, and other supplemental materials. All materials are also available in the Faculty Resource Course.



### Sample of Monday Morning Mentor Sessions Offered

- How do I get students to complete reading assessments? (*September 9, 2024*)
- How can I teach courses that are accessible to all learners? (*Septemeber 16, 2024*)
- How can I use assessment data to provide meaningful feedback and deeper learning? (*February 5, 2024*)
- How can I spark and sustain engagement in reluctant learners? (*April 1, 2024*)
- How can I help students who are struggling online? (*April 8, 2024*)



# GOAL 2

## Enhance Faculty and Student Experience and Engagement

### New Faculty Orientation and Training



The New Faculty Orientation and Training Program is designed to help new instructors navigate their first year at The Citadel and develop community with other faculty members. Over the course of the year, new instructors attend an initial training before classes start in August followed by monthly workshops covering a variety of topics. CEITL & DE also observe each new faculty member teach at least once in their first year to provide feedback and support.

This flexible, self-paced approach empowered faculty to enhance their skills and stay at the forefront of digital learning trends. ### Professional Reading Series (aka Book Club)

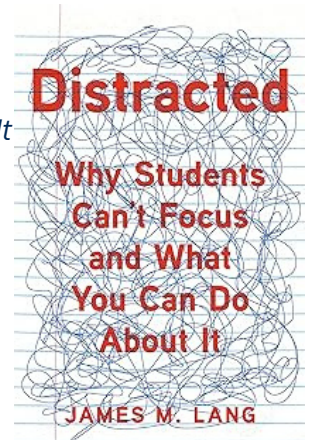

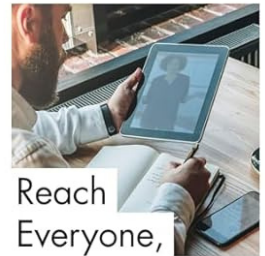
#### Fall 2023

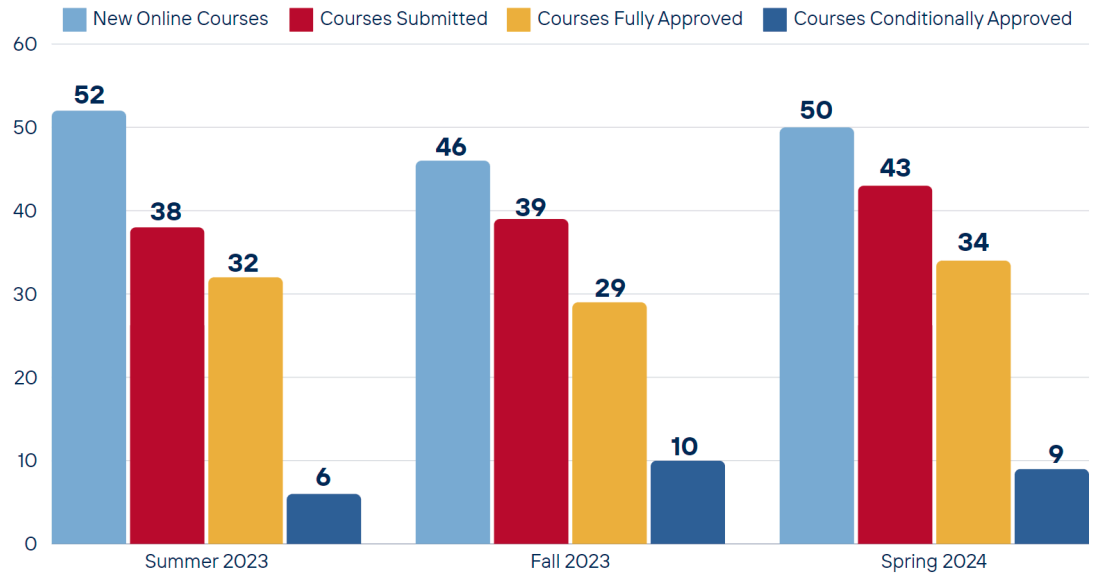

# GOAL 4

## Advance Citadel Online

### Citadel Online Course Reviews

Quality Matters (QM) is a research-based, faculty-centered, peer-review model for continuous improvement in online courses. It includes 44 standards that serve as a national benchmark for online course design. Over 100,000 members and over 1,300 member institutions in the US and internationally use Quality Matters.

The online course review process requires that faculty members build their courses fully within Canvas, complete a short survey that provides general information about their online course outcomes, structure, and organization, and submit a parity table that details their course instructional contact hours. CEITL&DE staff and CEITL&DE Faculty Fellows in Residence use the Quality Matters rubric to assess each course’s design. This year the Specific Review Standards from the QM Higher Education Rubric, Seventh Edition were adopted. Our goal is to have 100% of all online courses that are submitted for review meet 100% of the rubric standards.

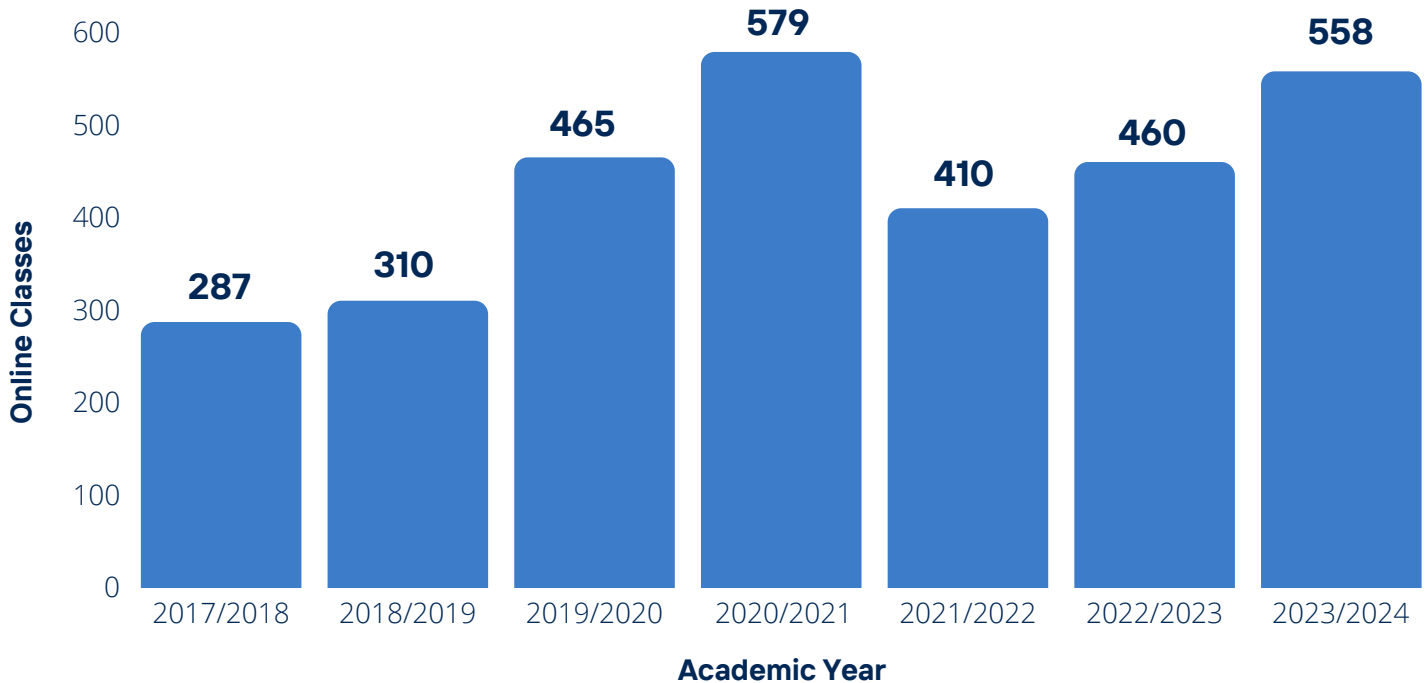


# Canvas (LMS) Management

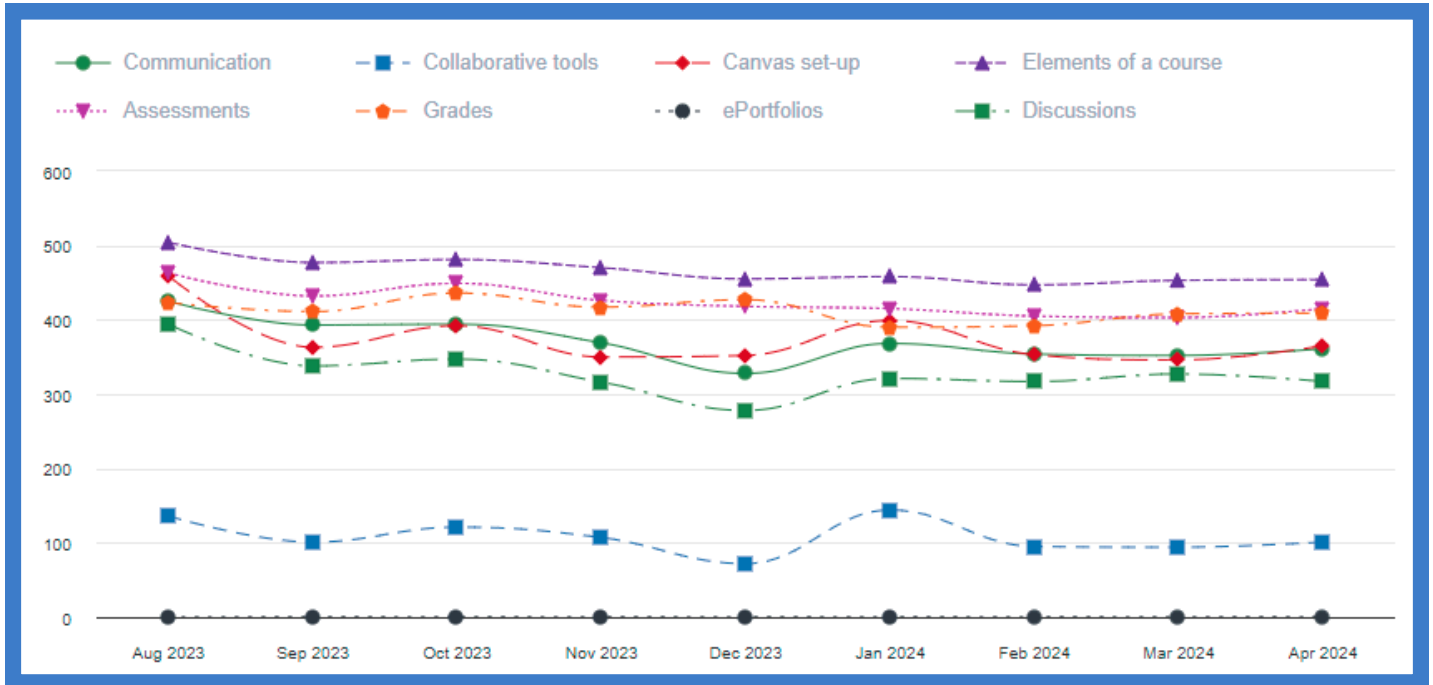

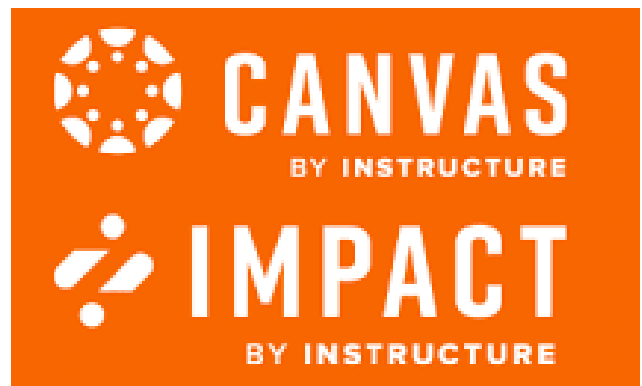
# Canvas Impact Dashboard

The chart above reflects the number of instructors during the Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 semester that have used each tool.

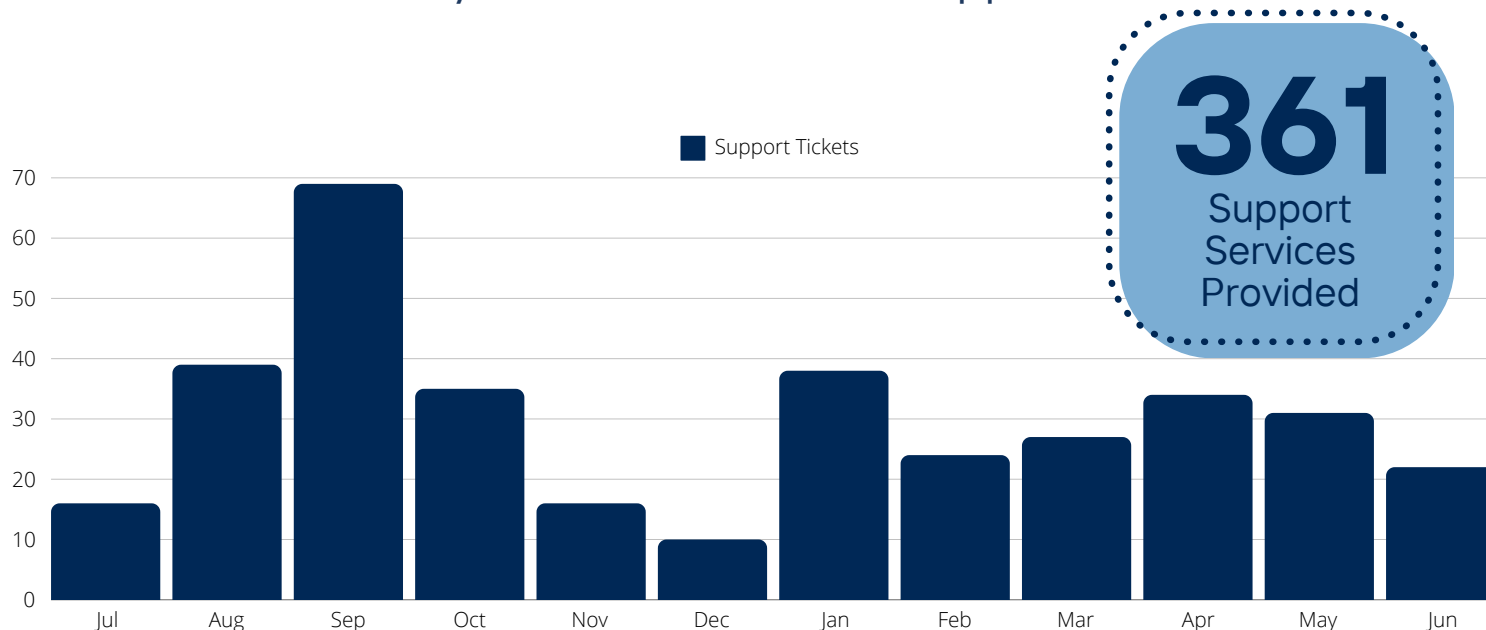

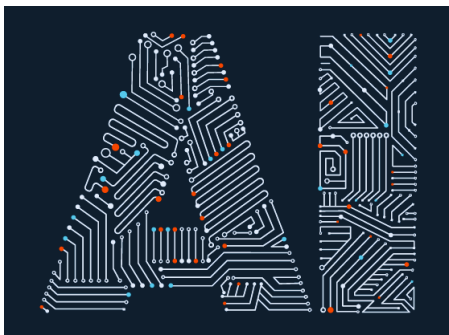

## Academic Integrity Based Trainings



Respondus LockDown Browser and Repondus Monitor is an online proctoring system that allows faculty to administer quizzes and tests in an online environment. This system maintains the integrity of the online exam process by locking the web browser so that students cannot print, copy or access any other applications. It also records students during the exam and provides a report and video that an instructor can review.



Turnitin is a similarity detection service that works by comparing submitted documents against a vast database of academic content, as well as internet sources and previously submitted papers, to identify similarities and potential instances of plagiarism.
