

USING GENERATIVE AT APPROPRIATELY AND ETHICALLY



The use of AI must be documented. AI content without proper attribution or authorization is considered a form of plagiarism.

The use of AI in any stage of your work's creation must be explicitly disclosed and thoroughly documented. Failure to do so can be an honor violation.



Engage ethically with AI.

Evaluate your Al-generated outputs and consider any potential biases, limitations and ethical implications. Respect privacy, confidentiality, and intellectual property rights.



Al should help you think, but not think for you.

Al should serve as a tool to assist and enhance your thought process rather than replacing it.



Confidential or personal data should never be entered in generative AI tools.

Al tools may expose data to third parties, lack confidentiality, and be vulnerable to data breaches.



You are responsible for your final product.

Al is known to make mistakes. You are fully accountable for Al-generated content. Make sure you can attribute and source all facts so they can be verified.
